Pentecost 2025


June 8 – Nov 23

Red is the color used on Pentecost Sunday. On this day we remember the power and fire of the Holy Spirit, “the Lord and Giver of Life.” The color red communicates the motif of strength – the strength and power the Holy Spirit gives in order for God’s people to call on the name of Jesus Christ and share that powerful name with others.

Pentecost begins fifty days after Easter. The season of Pentecost may last from 22 to 28 Sundays. Green is the appointed color for all but a few of these Sundays. The Sundays following Pentecost are called the season of the “green meadow,” as these Sundays also emphasize the subject of growth.

Pastor Mark's Remarks for July 2025

"Good Stewardship of Freedom"

You, my brothers and sisters, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the flesh; rather, serve one another humbly in love. For the entire law is fulfilled in keeping this one command: "Love your neighbor as yourself." If you bite and devour each other, watch out or you will be destroyed by each other. Galatians 5:13-15

Each July we as Americans celebrate freedom. Because of the sacrifices of those who have gone before us we are a free country. The question now is not how to become free, but how to be good stewards of our freedom.

The same is the case with our Christian freedom. Because of the sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross, we are free. The question now is not how to become spiritually free, but how to be good stewards of our freedom.

What does good stewardship of freedom look like?

1. It is self-giving – How well we are using our freedom is measured not by how much we gain for ourselves, but by how much we invest in and lift up others.
2. It is intentional – How well we are using our freedom is measured less by how well we are able to stay disengaged from the world, and more on how intentionally we engage the world to make it a better place.
3. It is used for healing and not to perpetuate sickness – How well we are using our freedom is measured less by how easy it is to get comfortable with and ignore our own brokenness and character defects, and more on how we intentionally pursue healing so we can better bless and serve others.

I am free, so how is my life raising the water level for others?

I am free, so how intentional am I to engage the world rather than avoid it?

I am free, so how intentionally am I addressing my brokenness and character defects so they don't keep holding me back from living the life I was designed to live?

Jesus, thank you that because of your cross I am free. May I not misuse my freedom by making it all about myself. Instead, may I be a wise steward of that freedom by intentionally using it to bless others and intentionally addressing the areas of brokenness in myself which limit my ability to live fully for my sake and fully become the blessing I was created to be for the sake of others. AMEN
