Pentecost 2025

June 8 – Nov 23

Red is the color used on Pentecost Sunday. On this day we remember the power and fire of the Holy Spirit, "the Lord and Giver of Life." The color red communicates the motif of strength – the strength and power the Holy Spirit gives in order for God's people to call on the name of Jesus Christ and share that powerful name with others.

Pentecost begins fifty days after Easter. The season of Pentecost may last from 22 to 28 Sundays. Green is the appointed color for all but a few of these Sundays. The Sundays following Pentecost are called the season of the "green meadow," as these Sundays also emphasize the subject of growth.

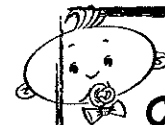

Pastor Mark's Remarks – November 2025***“Calling a Thing What it Is”***

“A theologian of glory calls evil good and good evil. A theologian of the cross calls the thing what it actually is.”

Martin Luther (Heidelberg Disputation – 1518)

One of the greatest gifts Lutheranism has to help solve the gradual degradation of society is the commitment to call a thing what it is.

As Martin Luther began to read and study the Bible for himself, he couldn't help but notice that much of what he read was not consistent with what he had been taught by the church of his day.

In the Heidelberg Disputation, Luther contrasted two different ways of doing church:

1. A Theology of Glory – trusting human understanding, human progress, money, power, willingness to compromise to align with secular culture to achieve desired goals.
2. Theology of the Cross – experiencing God in weakness and brokenness. Understanding the clearest picture of what God is like is Jesus suffering and dying on the cross out of love for us. Connecting with God through dependence on him to do what I can't do for myself. A life of humility and dependence on grace.

As he looked at the teachings of the church of his day, he saw mostly the the Theology of Glory, seeking to redefine reality to manipulate people into making religious professionals wealthy and powerful. As they kept redefining reality for their benefit, he saw they had forgotten how to call a thing what it really is and were living in a made-up fantasy world.

Calling a thing what it is:

1. God chose me in love before the foundation of the world to be adopted as his child.
2. I am saved by grace through faith not by my good works.
3. My life is not just about me but about how I become a blessing to my neighbor.
4. I am living from God's grace and love, not for it.
5. I will see God as he is when I die, but I can start to get to know what he is like in this life.

Martin Luther's generation was attracted to him because he told the truth in a culture that wasn't very good at telling the truth. They saw him explaining reality in a way that made sense to them and learned to live in the truth of both their sin and their callings.

We live in a time where both the culture and much of the church are not telling the truth about reality. Their twisted reality:
 Sin is not sin
 The devil and evil don't exist
 You can define your own reality
 We are too smart to depend on God. Human reason and progress are the answer.
 Today's young people are seeing through the lies. They are seeing the failure of dependence on human progress and life without God. They are seeing depression, mental illness, hopelessness, lack of meaning in life, and lack of healthy community increasing rather than decreasing.

Sounds like a good time for a new reformation. The more obvious it become we are living in lies, the more the younger generation will seek to start calling things what they really are.

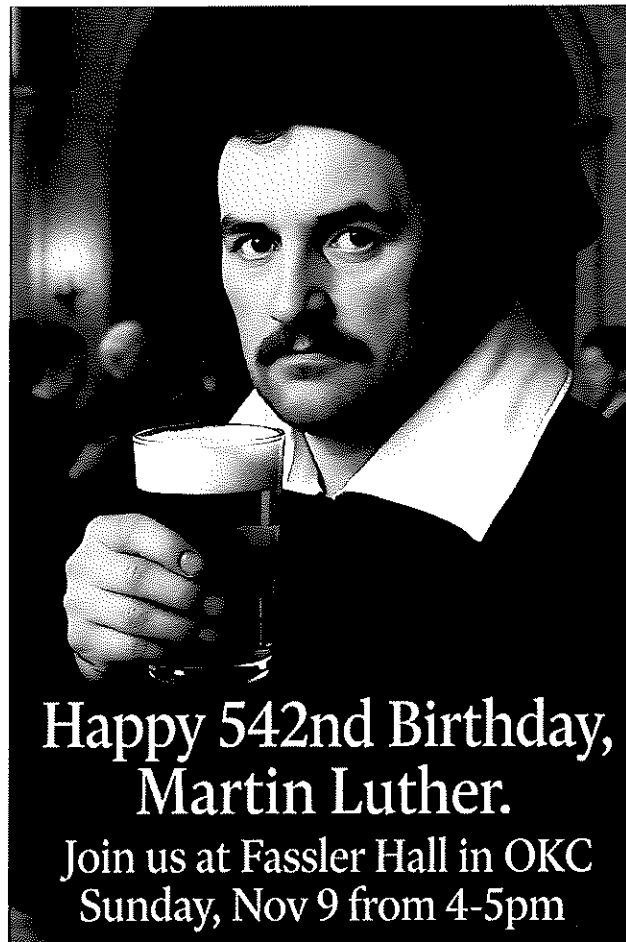
